Carnoustie Championship Course (Angus)

A demanding Open venue, famed for its dramatic finishes.

Key Considerations

There is a selection of standout courses from each area, offering a variety of styles, difficulty levels and unique characters.

Booking: Popular courses book out quickly, sometimes **years in advance**—reserve early, especially if your clients are travelling in peak season (April–October).

Handicaps: Some high-profile courses require official handicap certificates. Others are open to all abilities.

Off-Course Experiences: Golf in Scotland is about more than the game. Friendly clubhouses, whisky distilleries, historic sites, and local food all add to the experience.

Dress Code: Smart golf attire is standard, including collared shirts and tailored trousers or shorts.

Golf Club Hire: While many golfers visiting Scotland bring their own clubs, high-quality club hire is readily available at most courses and resorts. Sets often feature premium brands and suit a range of playing styles. Hiring is a convenient option for those travelling light or playing just a few rounds. Booking in advance is recommended, especially in peak season, to ensure availability and the right fit.

Course Etiquette & Pace: Scottish golf values tradition, with an emphasis on etiquette and steady pace. Visitors should repair pitch marks, replace divots, and consider hiring a caddie for local insight.

Weather: The Scottish climate can be unpredictable. Waterproofs and layers are always a wise addition.

Links vs. Parkland: Coastal links with firm fairways, pot bunkers and natural winds, and more sheltered inland parkland courses with tree-lined fairways. Playing both gives a well-rounded taste of Scottish golf.

Jargon Buster

Links Course – A coastal course built on sandy soil, often exposed to wind and natural elements.

Parkland Course – An inland course with lush fairways, trees, and defined landscaping.

Handicap – A numerical measure of a golfer's ability. Some courses require a maximum to ensure pace and quality of play.

Tee Time – A reserved start time to play a round of golf.

Ballot – A lottery-style draw used to allocate limited tee times, particularly at the Old Course in St Andrews.

Caddie – A local guide who carries a player's clubs and offers course advice.

Starter – The official who manages the first tee and ensures proper flow of players.

Clubhouse – The main building at a golf course with changing rooms, dining, and social spaces.

Par – The expected number of strokes for a skilled golfer to complete a hole or course.

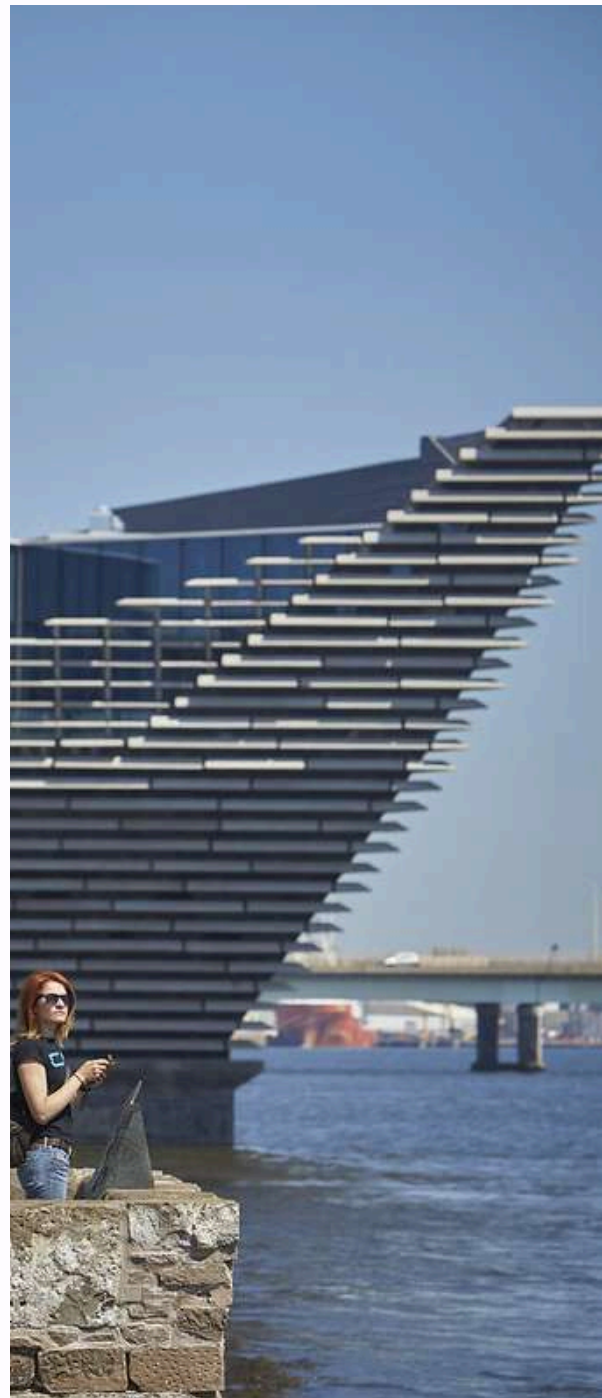

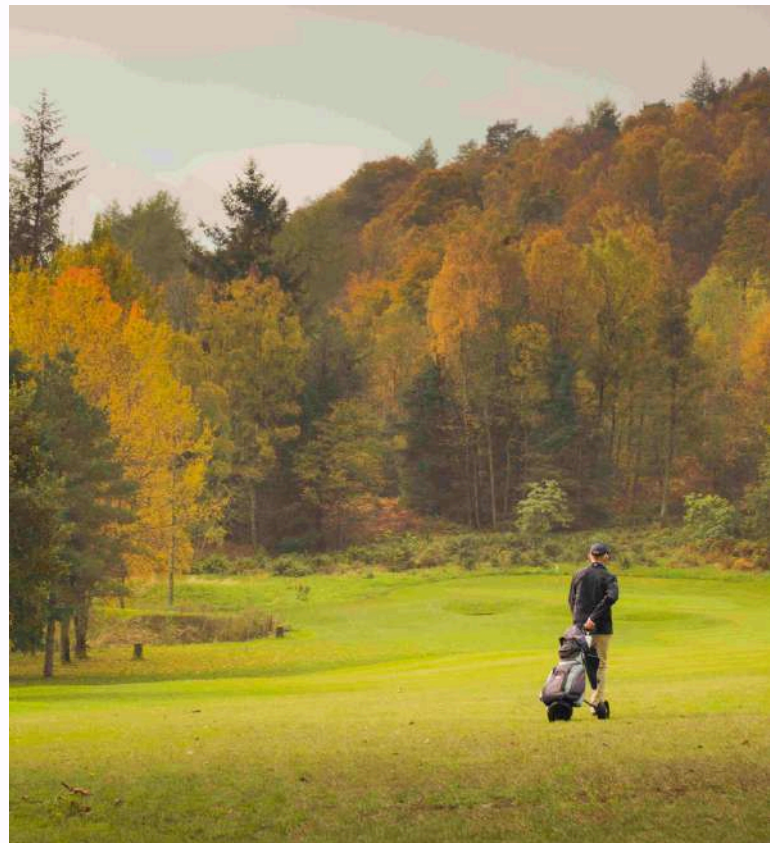

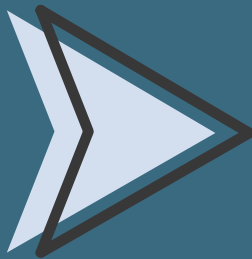
